# Southwest Region of the Astronomical League Report to AL Council, July 10, 2024

SWRAL - the Southwest Region of the Astronomical League - is one of the ten regions of the Astronomical League. It consists of AL member clubs and At-Large members located in Texas, New Mexico and parts of Oklahoma.

While SWRAL has assisted area clubs with events such as Okie-Tex Star Party, El Dorado Star Party and the Hill Country Astronomers Spring Banquet, the main focus continues to be its involvement with the annual Texas Star Party.

The SWRAL traditionally holds its annual meeting each year during the week of TSP, where there is the prospect of both high and convenient attendance by SWRAL clubs. However, this was impossible in 2024, because of the April 8<sup>th</sup> Solar Eclipse, whereby TSP was moved out of it usual May time frame at Prude Ranch in order to create a one-time event around the Solar Eclipse of April 8, 2024. Furthermore, Texas Star Party, Inc., is undergoing internal administrative reorganization.

The following slate of candidates was elected as SWRAL officers, at the SWRAL Annual Meeting, held via Zoom on May 28, 2024. Chairman David Moody has stepped down due to health reasons.

SWRAL still continues to coordinate with Texas Star Party, Inc, to organize and host the annual Texas Star Party, Eldorado Star Party and Oki-Tex Star Party. Nevertheless, SWRAL continues to look for new ways to serve member societies in the region without Texas Star Party.

SWRAL has maintained and expanded its website, SWRAL.ORG, to further its goals of astronomical outreach in its area of operation, which includes the Eastern corridor of Texas, comprised of DFW, Houston, Austin and San Antonio, and Oklahoma City, and the Western corridor, comprised of El Paso in Texas and Las Cruces, Rosawell, Alburquerque and Santa Fe, in New Mexico. The size of the region continues to be the region's greatest challenge to effective communications among our member societies.

SWRAL currently has approximately \$800 in its checking account. Chairman Gary Carter and Treasurer Dennis Wardell will open a new bank account at RBFCU in Allen, TX. They have received the Astronomical League Tax ID number to open this account. Once the new bank

account is created, they will then coordinate with outgoing treasurer, Alan Gilchrist, to transfer by check the funds currently in the existing bank account in Fort Davis. This is necessary because it is not possible to add new signatories to the existing account. The main challenge in this effort is to find a bank that will offer a free account, so that our small assets will not be used up on monthly fees.

Youth Outreach is an important part of SWRAL activities, as well as of the Texas Star Party. Because of active and successful youth programs in larger clubs in the region, junior members of the Texas Astronomical Society of Dallas, and other clubs, have applied for and been awarded Youth Awards from the Astronomical League in 2024. These awards will be presented at ALCon 2024 in Kansas City.

Eclipse activities have been an important part of SWRAL activities in 2023-2024.

The Annular Solar Eclipse of October 14, 2023, was widely observed across the region, with clubs in Albuquerque, Roswell, Midland/Odessa, San Angelo, San Antonio, and Corpus Christi in the direct path of the eclipse.

The Total Solar Eclipse of April 8, 2024, was a national event. Clubs along the I-35 Corridor were in the direct path of the eclipse, including Uvalde, San Antonio, Austin, Waco, Fort Worth, Dallas and Texarkana. In addition to club outreach activities and observing parties, national organizations across the country, including Astronomy Magazine and Flagstaff Observatory, organized large events aimed at the general public across the path of the eclipse.
